SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1 Description of first aid measures:

Skin contact:

Remove contaminated clothing, wash affected skin with soap and water, rinse thoroughly with water, in case of irritation, consult a doctor.

Eye contact:

Rinse for several minutes (about 15) with plenty of water, holding eyelids apart. Avoid strong stream, due to the risk of corneal damage, contact your doctor.

Inhalation:

In the event of dizziness or nausea, remove casualty to fresh air, if symptoms persist, obtain medical advice.

Do not induce vomiting, rinse your mouth with water, immediately contact your doctor.

5.1. Extinguishing media:

During a fire, high temperature, release toxic decomposition products (carbon oxides).
